Jim Reynolds' papers provided George's middle name and complete birth date. Mr. Reynolds stated that Louisa Schull and George Espy married in 1830 in Wilkes-Barre. Mr. Reynolds confirmed Louisa was from Woodstown, New Jersey.

Stevens, Warder W., Centennial History of Washington County, Indiana... with Biographical Sketches, reprint 1916, pages 435-6, cites that George E. Telle owned a tanning yard outside the city. Between 1864 and 1868 Henry Clark "was a terror" in Salem. He drank heavily. On April 11, 1868, the Good Templars met at a Temperance Rally. Henry Clark fired into the crowd, mortally wounding G. E. Telle. Mr. Clark served jail time and later was rehabilitated.

James E. Bolding, Obituaries, Selected Newspapers of Washington County, Indiana, [The Salem Leader, January 22, 1887] -- Mrs. Louisa Telle, widow of George E. Telle, died at the residence of her son, Rev. G. W. Telle, Thursday at 3:30 pm, after an illness of eight weeks. Mrs. Telle was one of Salem's oldest citizens, having come to Salem from Philadelphia, Pa., in 1843. Soon after making Salem her home she united with the M. E. Church and continued in its communion until her death. The last three years she spent with her daughter, Mrs. Lizzie M. South, at Hamilton Ohio, and returned to her old home but a few months since to spend the remainder of her days with her children in Salem. She was a good woman, filling well but quietly her station as wife, mother, friend and Christian. She attained the ripe age of 78 years. Her last days were cheered and made comfortable, as far as it was possible, by the presence and tender, loving ministrations of her children, all of whom were present at her bedside during the illness. The funeral services will be held at the old family home Sunday at 2 o'clock, p.m. All are invited to attend." Other references in this book say she was born in New Jersey, died 20 January 1887, wife of George E. Telle; nee Schull. Another says she was 78 and was a native of Woodstown New Jersey. Another obit says, "Mrs. Louisa Telle, widow of George E. Telle, died at her home in this place the 20th inst., aged 78 years. She had been a resident of Salem for forty-four years, and was well and favorably known, and highly respected for her many noble qualities. She was the mother of Mrs. Dr. John Pitts, of Kansas City; Charles Telle, of Arkansas; Mrs. C. W. Mobley, Rev G. W. Telle, and Edwin Telle, of Salem."

Obituary of Earl Tracy Telle states he died after a week's illness of peritonitis at the age of 17.

George W. Telle's obituary says, "Rev. George W. Telle, who has been in such a critical condition for some time, passed away . . . at the ripe age of 88 years. The deceased was the oldest member of the New Albany Presbytery in both age and years of service and was greatly revered by all the citizens of Salem. A very impressive service was held at the Presbyterian church Saturday afternoon that was largely attended. . . . At the age of 12 years, he came with his parents to Salem where they established a home in the house that has been the family home till the time of his death. When twenty-five years of age, he entered Asbury (DePauw) University to prepare himself for the ministry. After graduation, he taught [for seven years and] then took up his work in the ministry in the Methodist church . . . He then affiliated himself with the Presbyterian church. . . . About fifteen years ago he was compelled to relinquish active service in the ministry, but thereafter was to be found regularly in his pew, although, in recent years, was unable to hear a word of the service. . . ."

Martha E. Dickey Telle's obituary, "Martha Elizabeth Telle, daughter of Anthony and Belinda Dickey, was born October 2, 1853, near Lookout Mountain, in Alabama . . . The family, being Northern sympathizers, moved to Indiana during the Civil War and settled near Paoli where she spent her girlhood days. It was here that she met the Rev. George W. Telle who was serving the Methodist church as pastor. . . . In her girlhood she was a member of the Baptist Church. Upon her marriage she affiliated with the Methodist church. Several years later she and her husband transferred their membership to the Presbyterian church, which they served faithfully until death. She was actively engaged in church work and especially enjoyed the Sunday School. As long as health would permit, she was an active member of the Order of Easter Star, Daughters of Rebekah, the Pythian Sisters and the Woman's Relief Corps of which organization she was the last surviving local charter member. She was a member of this organization for over 40 years. . . . She leaves . . . three sons, one daughter, eleven grandchildren, five great-grandchildren and a host of relatives and friends."

Jim Reynolds' papers provided dates and names of Arthur A. Telle's family.

History of Washington County, IN 1916-1976, page 558, "All the other children of Lucius and Ellen Martin left Washington Co., except Mason Martin (b 4-29-1881 m 7-1937 d 11-21-1950 who was manager of the Salem Office Pub. Ser. Co. He married Louise (Telle) Martin (b 7-2-1881 d 4-30-1965) a retired Salem teacher who owned and lived in the John Hay House."

Clara Marie Burns, Death Records Washington County, Index 1882-1950. Records state that Melinda and Anthony Dickey are buried in Crown Hill Cemetery in Salem.

Index to Marriage Records, Orange County, Indiana 1826-1920 inclusive, 977.277 V22im Volume 1, provide marriage record of Lydia Dickey and husband Thomas Dickey.

Supplemental Marriage Records of Orange County, Index, 1880-1920, indicates son Anthony T. married Emma Faulkner and they had a daughter Nellie, "Nellie Blanch Dickey fa: Anthony T. (sic) mo: Emma Faulkner f w age 19 11/25/1909." I'm not sure this is the right Anthony.

Connie Webb and Harry Bryan provided information for this family.

Mary Lusana Dickey is shown in several records and even in a family letter as Mary S. Dickey.

Belinda Malinda Miriam Head was known by all these names on various records, in addition to occasionally being called Susannah.

His obituary : "Albert Espy Telle, son of the Rev. George W. and Martha E. Telle, was born August 5, 1878, at Waverly, Indiana, and died July 17, 1939, after a long period of declining health. He was nearing his sixty-eighth birthday. He was the eldest of five children, three of whom survive. When he was about 10 years of age the family came to Salem, where the remainder of his life was spent. At an early age he joined the Presbyterian church and remained a member of that religious organization for the remainder of his life, being one of the ruling elders at the time of his death. He was a member of the Knights of Pythias, the Masonic fraternity and the Red Men. He was interested especially in the Pythian Sisters. He was one of the number responsible for its organization in Salem. He served as an employee in the Salem post office under Postmaster Lewis Dennis and was bookkeeper in the Bank of Salem for about seventeen years. Several years ago he served the town of Salem as clerk and at the time of his death was the city's clerk-treasurer, having entered upon the duties of that office last January. . . ."

Another obituary added, "The deceased had been absent from the City Hall since July seventh, when he asked to be accompanied home because of illness. In 1932, he suffered a severe chest injury in a motor accident near his home in Morris addition, from which he never fully recovered. He bravely faced life's acid tests."

The obituary of Mary E. King Telle, "'Mary E. King Telle, daughter of Benjamin V. and Sarah Ellen Chenoweth King, born Fredericksburg, Indiana Jan., 30, 1878 and died in Washington County Hospital 1962, age 84. Married Dec. 25, 1901 to Albert Telle, who died July 1939. She was a member of the Salem Presbyterian Church. Survived by four sons: Edwin and Bruce of Salem; Kenneth of Valparaiso; and George of West Sacramento California. Two daughters, Ruth Stewart, Rt. 2, Salem, and Sarah Ferguson, Paris, Tennessee. Four sisters: Emma Purkhiser, California; Rose Malone, Borden; Anna DeWeese, Milltown; Susie Utz, New Mexico. A brother, Albert King, 11 grandchildren and 7 great grandchildren. She is also survived by a sister-in-law- Louise Telle Martin, (Mrs. Mason) with whom she lived many years. She is buried in Crown Hill.

gentle to all, quiet and unpretentious in her spirit and
manners, she was the object of esteem on the part of all who
knew her. Her last sickness was a season of prolonged and
intense pain, but she found great comfort and support in the
conscious presence of her Savior. In her suffering she was
heard to say that she ought not to complain since God had
been so good as to allow her to live many years without
serious sickness. She expressed herself as willing and
waiting to go. She talked of dying as one talking of going
home. After ten weeks of almost constant pain, she entered
into the rest that remaineth unto the people of God." A
second obituary said Nancy "was a highly respected maiden
lady" whose "her interment took place at the Brewer
[Cooley] Graveyard south of Salem. She was a sister of C.

Nodaway County Necrology, 977.8124 H2hj. "22 March 1897, John Pitts, a printer, shot himself in the breast, supposed to have been crazed from morphine, inflicting only a slight injury."

James E. Bolding, Obituaries, Selected Newspapers of Washington County, Indiana, 977.222V4b. The obituary for Caroline's mother Louisa Schull Telle in 1887 says her daughter was "Mrs. Dr. John Pitts, of Kansas City." The obituary of sister Mary Ann Telle Mobley in 1899 says Carolyn was in Maryville but too ill to attend the funeral.

Farrell Stewart confirmed John Booth Pitts is the husband of Caroline Telle and not his uncle John Pitts.

Washington County Obituaries, 1888-1944, "From Maryville, Mo, we note the death of John B. Pitts, formerly a well-known citizen of Salem. Dr. John Booth Pitts was born at Salem 27 April 1834, died at Maryville, May 6, 1891, aged 57 years, 9 days. On May 20, 1857, he was united in marriage to Miss Caroline Telle, which union was blessed with 5 children. About this time he began the practice of medicine. In 1872 he moved with his family to Olathe, Kansas, but two years later he returned to his old home in Indiana. There, within a short time, three of his children died. This unusual inroad into the family circle, in his language, 'broke my heart.' He soon left Indiana, resided in Kansas two years, then at different places in the Southern part of Mo., thence to Maryville four years ago. He was an invalid for nine years, and a silent sufferer from that dread disease, consumption."

Farrell Stewart provided and confirmed some of the Pitts research. Mr. Stewart says Thomas' birth date is 27 Sep 1791 and he was from Stokes Co, NC. While this particular date doesn't match other data, his information has proved to be extremely reliable.

October 1823." This date is difficult to understand, as the death record showed her husband Thomas died in 1879. 1823 is the year they were married.

Washington County Indiana Marriage Records 1815 - 1833 977.222V2w, gives the marriage date for Thomas Pitts and Darcus (sic) Trueblood as 17 June 1823.

Farrell Stewart's Pitt Family Research (copies in my possession) provided many names and dates. He has done extensive research on Pitts and related families. **Andrew Pitts** and his wife **Margaret Braxton** were early pioneers of Washington County, Indiana and because these families were so large, they had ties to many early settlers. Farrell Stewart recorded, "Andrew's daughter Mary Lindley preceded him to Washington County, Indiana Territory. It was in March 1809 that Andrew packed up the covered wagon with his family, followed the Ohio River, and six weeks later arrived at the home of his son-in-law and daughter, William and Mary Lindley. With the wagon covers the Pitts family constructed a tent in which they lived until a cabin could be erected. Andrew Pitts built a cabin on a hill, on the south side of what is now Salem, on the Charlestown Road and near where the Quaker meeting house and school stood. The cabin was made of poles and was only 14 feet square, had no windows or doors - only a quilt hung up at the door opening to keep out the cold and wind. Andrew Pitts would travel on horseback to Louisville, Kentucky for supplies, being gone for several days at a time. Back he would come with bread supplies and material to be spun, carded, woven and made into clothing. He tried growing flax, but flax did not grow well in the area. Other grains he grew were taken to Beck Mill for processing. Unless there was a deep snow, the stock thrived on the grass and pea vines that grew in abundance in most parts of the country."

He is the last survivor of his family, his parents, three sisters and two brothers preceding him. Funeral services were held at Oxford Sunday afternoon, and burial was beside his companion there."

I believed Alice and Edwin South were siblings but I could not find them in a family together until I was contacted by Betty Donato, a descendant of Edward South. She provided me with family information that has proved to be very accurate and helpful.

Jim Reynolds' papers provide full birth and death dates of Edwin and Alice. Mr. Reynolds gave Edwin's middle name of Tracy, and provided their marriage date. His papers said Alice's name was Allacilla, but I discounted that until Betty Donato contacted me and confirmed that. Betty's information is included on the family sheet for Thomas Jonas South and Tabitha Morris.

Washington County birth records show two births and two deaths of baby girls on 14 July 1883 born to Alice and Edwin. Other county records appear to record duplicate births, but no evidence of duplicate deaths appeared, so the choice was made to assume there had been twin girls born to this couple who both died.

This information had the complete middle name of Montgomery for Edward South. She also provided the death place of Elizabeth Telle and accurate information for Noble South, and the correct parents for George E. South.

Martha Telle Cannon Letters state Elizabeth lived in Hamilton, Ohio in 1893.

Martha Telle Cannon letters state that Charles lived in Gainsville, Arkansas in 1893, and in Pacific, Missouri in 1899.

Jim Reynolds' papers add the first two given names for Belle and provide the middle name of Hamilton for Charles. Mr. Reynolds' papers were given to me by Rosemary Dunn Smith, a granddaughter of Opal Telle. She received the papers from her mother. Mr. Reynolds provided Charles' and Belle's marriage date as well as Belle's parents' names. Included with the Reynolds information is a photo-copy of two pages from a family record of the Boyer family. Belle's name is shown there as Mary Suzzie Belle Boyer. Census enumerators showed her as Belle or Mary. Separate information with the Reynolds papers refers to her as "Mary Belle Boyer." Her birth date on these separate pages is shown as 21 November 1860. Rosemary recorded that her Grandfather Hufsmith had a sister named Gladys who was mentally handicapped. Belle took care of Gladys for many years after the death of Gladys' mother.

Death Certificate for Charles Hamilton Telle. Mary Suzzie Belle Boyer's death certificate says she was a music teacher and died of bronchial pneumonia. The death certificate states she was buried in Salem, Indiana, but family members are sure she is buried in Colorado.

Jim Reynold's papers provided Asenath Scott's name and partial birth date. Family tradition says Asenath is a descendant of Sir Walter Scott. Many Scott families lived in Edgar County, Illinois. Determining if any were Asenath's parents was not possible with the data available. Information for child Asenath Harriett came from barely legible photocopy record included with the Jim Reynolds' information. The year, almost illegible, was assumed to be 1858 because Mary Suzzie Belle Boyer's name is next, and she was born in 1860. There is another child's name that cannot be read.
